I, Eric Schachter, hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am a Vice President of A.B. Data, Ltd.'s Class Action Administration Division ("A.B. Data"), whose corporate office is located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. I am fully familiar with the facts contained herein based upon my personal knowledge. My telephone number is (414) 961-7535.
- 2. I submit this Declaration in connection with the class action notice and settlement administration proceedings related to the above-captioned action (the "Action") pursuant to the terms of this Court's Order Re Class Notice Program dated October 21, 2022 (the "Notice Order") (Case 3:17-md-02801-JD, ECF No. 1552). I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein and, if called as a witness, could and would testify competently thereto.
- 3. This Declaration details the steps that were taken to implement notice of the Settlements under the terms of the proposed notice plan and the Court's Notice Order. Those steps included the following:
 - Mailing, via U.S. Mail, and emailing the Short-Form Notice to potential Class Members;
 - Disseminating the Short-Form Notice as a news release to announce the Settlements; and
 - c. Updating the case-specific settlement website, www.capacitorsindirectcase.com.

DISSEMINATION OF DIRECT NOTICE

4. Pursuant to the Notice Order, A.B. Data was responsible for providing direct notice of the Settlements to all potential Class Members who could be reasonably identified. Although the Settlements are limited to Class Members in six indirect purchaser states (*i.e.*, California, Florida, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, and New York), A.B. Data provided direct notice to potential Class Members in all states to effectively reach the greatest practicable number of Class Members and provide them with every reasonable opportunity to understand that their legal rights are affected. Limiting direct notice to potential Class Members in the six states would neither have been significantly more efficient nor cost-effective. It has also been our experience that businesses that purchase certain products may, on occasion, do so through divisions, subsidiaries, related

entities, or units that might be located in other states, including the six states at issue here, potentially entitling them to share in the Settlements for those purchases.

- 5. On November 9, 2021, A.B. Data caused the Short-Form Notice formatted as an email to be emailed to 9,184 known purchasers of capacitors' email addresses. To maximize deliverability, A.B. Data used certain best practices, such as avoiding attachments and certain key words likely to trigger SPAM. Of the 9,184 emails sent, 8,411 were successfully delivered. Only 773 emails, or about 8% of the emails sent, were undeliverable.
- 6. On November 4, 2021, A.B. Data caused the Short-Form Notice formatted as a postcard ("Postcard Notice") to be mailed via First-Class Mail, postage prepaid, to 425,698 known indirect purchasers of capacitors. Prior to mailing, all mailing addresses were standardized and updated using the National Change of Address ("NCOA") system maintained by the United States Postal Service ("USPS") in an effort to improve deliverability rates. A true and correct copy of the Postcard Notice is attached to this Declaration as Exhibit A.
- As of the date of this Declaration, the USPS has returned 81,116 Postcard Notices 7. to A.B. Data as undeliverable as addressed ("UAA"). Of the UAA Postcard Notices, 98 included updated addresses provided by the USPS and were promptly re-mailed. Of the 81,018 UAA Postcard Notices that did not include updated addresses, A.B. Data identified 29,542 updated addresses using third-party information providers to which we subscribe and promptly re-mailed Postcard Notices to the updated mailing addresses.

DISSEMINATION OF NEWS RELEASE

8. Pursuant to the Notice Order, on November 5, 2021, A.B. Data disseminated a nationwide news release over Business Wire announcing the Settlements. A true and correct copy of the release is attached as Exhibit B.

WEBSITE

9. On November 4, 2021, A.B. Data updated the case-specific website, www.capacitorsindirectcase.com, with updated information concerning the Settlements to assist potential Class Members in understanding the terms of the Settlements and their included rights. The website provides general information about the Settlements; links to the Long-Form Notice, Claim Form, Settlement Agreements, and other relevant pleadings and filings; and provides functionality for potential Class Members to submit their claims online.

TELEPHONE HELPLINE

10. On November 4, 2021, A.B. Data updated the interactive voice response ("IVR") system for the case-specific toll-free number, 866-217-4245, with information concerning the Settlements. The automated attendant answers calls and presents callers with a series of choices in response to basic questions. If callers require further assistance, they have the option of transferring their calls to a live operator during business hours.

EXCLUSION REQUESTS RECEIVED

- 11. Pursuant to the Notice Order and as detailed in the Short-Form Notice and Long-Form Notice, potential Class Members had the opportunity to request exclusion from the Settlement Class. The deadline to submit a request for exclusion was February 18, 2022. Attached hereto as Exhibit C is the list of the three persons and entities that have requested exclusion.
- 12. The notices also provided instructions for potential Class Members to submit objections to or comments about any aspect of the Settlements. The instructions directed potential Class Members to submit their objection to the Court, by mail or in person, no later than February 18, 2022. To date, A.B. Data has not received any objections.

CLAIMS RECEIVED

- 13. Pursuant to the instructions on the Claim Form and the Long-Form Notice, qualified claimants that previously submitted a claim that qualified for a payment under the terms of this settlement were not required to resubmit another Claim Form to receive a benefit from the Settlements. Indeed, Class Members that previously submitted a valid claim will automatically receive a *pro rata* amount from these Settlements, in addition to the *pro rata* amounts due to them as a result of previous settlements in this litigation. The deadline for Class Members to submit a claim was February 18, 2022.
- 14. Taking into account the newly claimed purchasers, together with Class Members that previously submitted claims from the six states, we have identified 5,869 such claims. The

foregoing corresponds to a claims rate of 25.52% based on an estimated 23,000 Class Members. 1 Based on my experience in other matters, this is an excellent result. 15. In the coming weeks, A.B. Data will continue its efforts to conduct audits and secondary reviews of the submitted claims to determine validity, eliminate duplicates of previously submitted claims, and cull out any fraudulent claims. A.B. Data will provide the Court and the parties to the above-captioned action with updated information regarding claims processing and settlement distribution in connection with IPPs' motion for authorization to distribute the settlement funds to be filed at a later date. CONCLUSION 16. It is my opinion, based on my individual expertise and experience and that of my A.B. Data colleagues, that the notice plan described herein effectively reached potential Class Members, delivered plain language notices designed to capture potential Class Members' attention, and provided them with the information in an informative and easy to understand manner that is necessary to effectively understand their rights and options. For these reasons, in my opinion, this notice plan satisfied the requirements of Rule 23 and Due Process.
